 - Marketing (bank, liquor store, dollar store, bakery, YMCA, used clothing and furniture stores)

- Improve drinking water quality
- Improve lighting
- Finish or improve fencing along Canal Street
- Remove buildings on Canal Street
- Determine best use for parking lot on Canal Street
- Survey Villages of similar size to get strategies for success (Sackets Harbor, Green (NY))
- Orient buildings so that they face the canal
- Embrace the community as a waterfront village presence identity
- Establish a Village Square
- Relocate/improve post office and library
- Development f recreation and entertainment opportunities for residents/tourists of all ages
- Develop historic sites
- Create a Visitor Center/Community Center a place to display Village history (Sweet Building?)

Focus on music, art and theater – provide venues for local artists to display work and talent

- Provide year round entertainment and events utilize Henley Park and Sweet Building
- Re-instate Farmer's Market, festivals, bed races opportunities for crafters, artists and farmers to share their goods and services
- Activities are just as important as buildings/structures
